Sleepy Spiders

Water spiders **hibernate** in the winter. Some water spiders seal off their webs with silk and stay inside. Others spin webs inside empty shells. The spiders sleep inside until the water warms up.

Amazing but True!

Water spiders live underwater, but they still breathe air. These clever spiders store hundreds of air bubbles in their webs. They gather the bubbles at the surface of the water. Tiny leg hairs hold the bubbles while they swim to their webs.

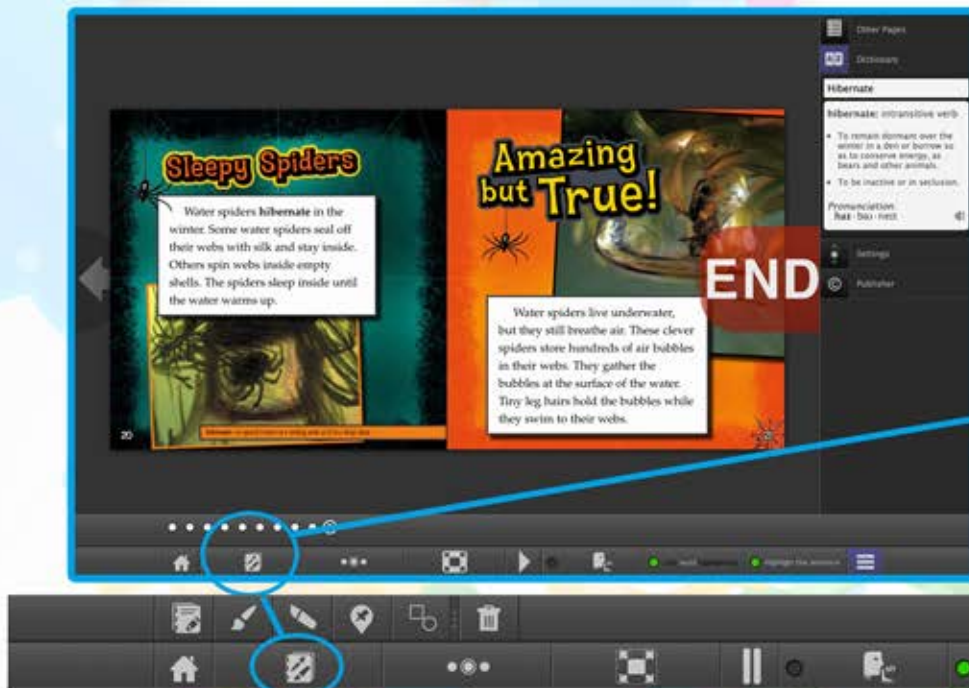

Use your journal to take notes about a book, other topics, add citations or even copy and paste text from a book directly into a journal entry.

Use your drawing tool to add drawings or shapes directly onto the text, illustrations or photos on a page. Use the built in eraser to remove any drawings or brush strokes.

Use any of the four highlighter colors to focus in on important words, phrases or sentences on a page. If you make a mistake, use the eraser to remove any of your highlights. Sticky notes will change to the corresponding color if you drag them over on top of what you highlight.

Use your sticky notes to take notes while reading, ask questions for further research, respond to your reading and help you keep track of important information you are learning. You can add multiple sticky notes on a page.

Use one of the shape options to draw lines, circles, boxes or arrows around important information on a page. Use the built in eraser if you make a mistake or want to change the shape to a different color.

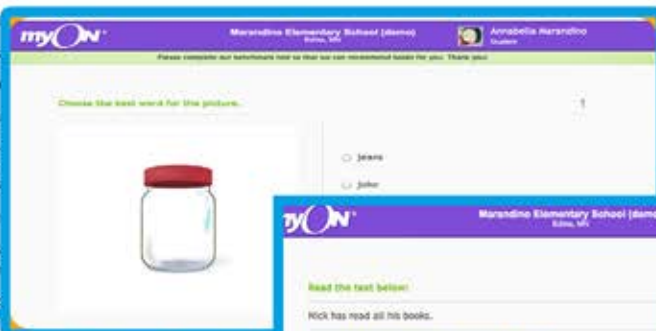

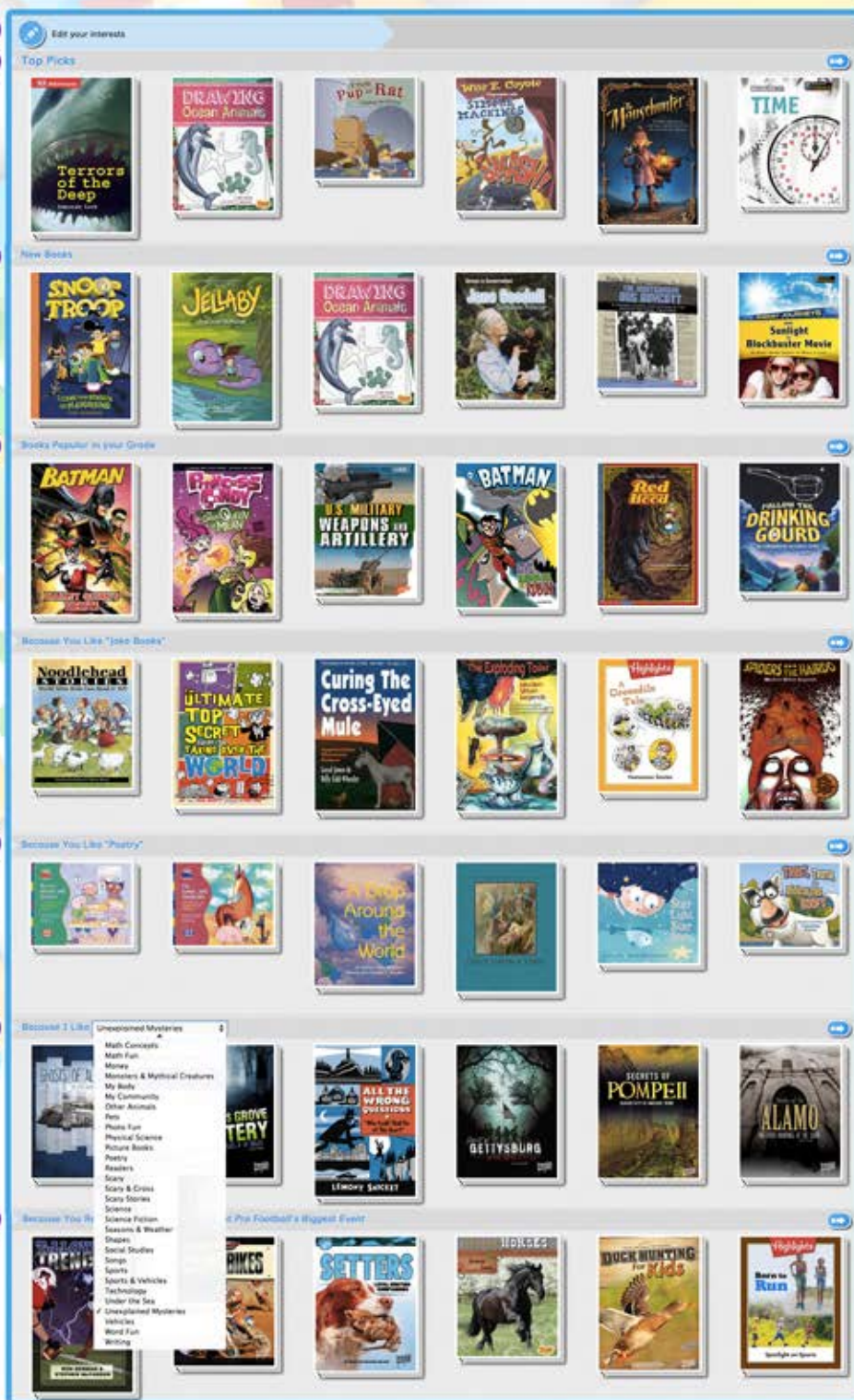
