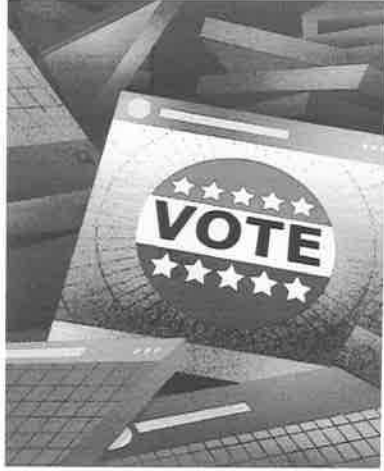

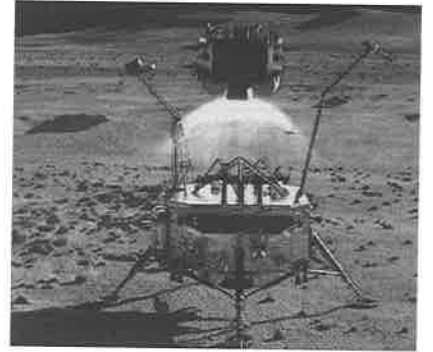

Back To The Moon

It has been forty years since a space agency was sent to the moon to collect samples. But on November twenty-third China sent up a spacecraft with the intention of collecting samples. By using one of its most powerful rockets China launched. The Chang'e 5 spacecraft named after an ancient Chinese moon goddess. A spacecraft is a vehicle or machine designed specifically for outer space. If everything runs smoothly the Chang'e 5 will collect moon samples, such as rocks and soil. It will then bring the samples back to Earth by mid-December. The main job is to gather about 2 kilograms (4.4 pounds) of rocks and soil from the moon. It's said that the Chang'e 5 mission will help scientists understand what was happening during the late moon's history. It might also help scientists learn more about how the Earth and the solar system developed over time.

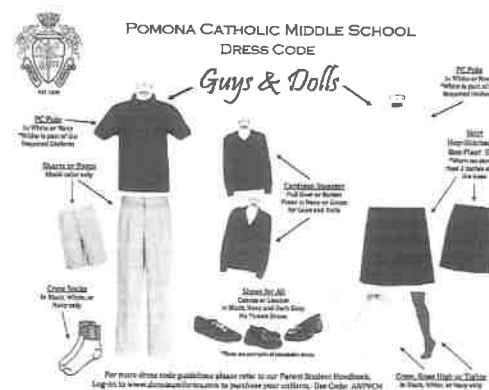
School Uniforms

for the school by promoting school spirit.

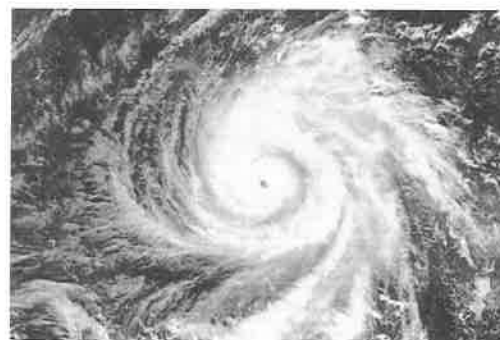

Hurricanes are very dangerous. They are like regular storms, but with water. They can be very big and can also blow up to 119 kilometers (km) per hour (74 miles per hour) or higher. It goes faster than the fastest animal on land, which is a cheetah.



Here are some of the parts of a hurricane. Let's start up with the eye. The eye is at the center of the hurricane from the bottom underwater. The winds in the eye are lighter or

may not even be blowing at all and skies may be only partly cloudy.

Next is the eye wall. The eye walls are the thunderstorms swirling around the eye. The wall is where all the winds are strongest and the rain is heaviest.

Lastly we have the rain bands. Rain bands are clouds, rain and thunderstorms going outside of a hurricane's eye wall. Those bands can grow up to hundreds of miles wide and sometimes it might turn into a tornado.

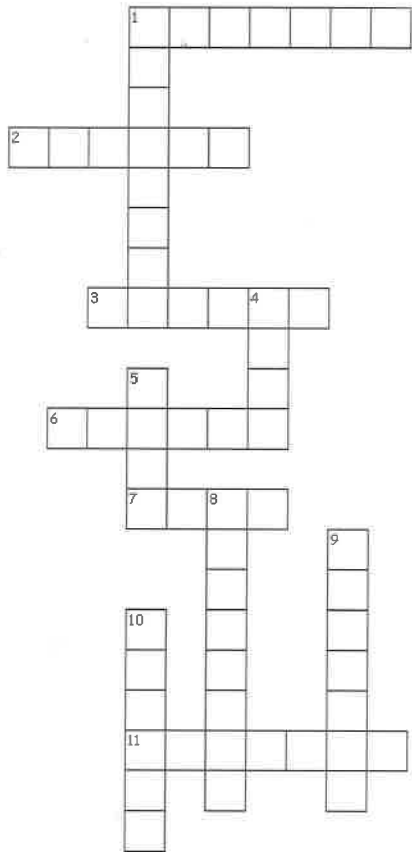
